Freya has taken part in kickboxing for five years and trains at Gouldings Martial Arts in Farnworth where she also teaches children's and adult's kickboxing classes. She was selected to take part in an eightweek training camp in Portugal where she won the world title in continuous kickboxing knock-out competition in the 15–17-year-old under 60kg category in Albufeira Stadium.

In September, The Sixth Form welcomed it's very first cohort of T Level students. The Education ϑ Early Years T Level combines classroom learning with 750 hours of placement and has been designed to help young people develop skills and knowledge needed to go onto employment or higher education in the education and early years sector.

We are also delighted to share that second-year A-Level Mathematics, Further Mathematics and Physics student, Shayaan Al-Asmi, reached the finals of the Discover Economics Young Economist of the Year Competition. The competition which attracted over 2,700 participants this year, sponsored by KPMG, is an annual event aimed at Year 10 to 13 students to encourage them to produce their own ideas in analysing contemporary economic problems facing the UK and the world.






















B6 RICH EVENTS
