Tasks to complete – hand them in when you start in September:

TASK ONE: Do a mind map on paper of topics from GCSE Geography that are similar for A level (use the specification link below to read). If you don't like mind maps, do a list or table. The topics are Hazards, Coasts (not glaciation), Globalisation, Regenerating places, Water & Energy, Superpowers, and Migration, Identity & Sovereignty. Don't worry if you have not done all of these before! Add some knowledge and details, e.g. key terms, case studies, sub-topics etc. that you know from GCSE.
